Year 8Y Technology students have been studying plant propagation techniques as well as native plants and their use in garden design. This was the lead up to assist them to establish a small native garden within the school. This is the second project completed by a Year 8 Technology class.

The class was required to draw a scale map, research plant growth habits, soil requirements and basic budgeting. Students prepared the site and constructed a retaining wall. Students were given a budget and had to produce a design plan on their scale map of the area along with a costing for plants required. Work, Health and Safety considerations were also addressed as students progressed through the exercise.

The finishing touches were added on Monday 3rd September with the mulch laid down to conserve moisture and keep soil temperature as constant as possible.

Commitment by Gundagai High Agriculture Students Leads to Success at Royal Melbourne Show.

Four Agriculture students from Gundagai High School have won individual Parader ribbons at the 2012 Royal Melbourne Show. Billie-Joe Carberry (Year 9) and Harrison Daley (Year 7) were both placed 4th for their age group from 25 other competitors from across Victoria and New South Wales. Joseph Carberry (Year 7) and Miles Hunt (Year 10) were placed fifth in their respective age groups. "This was the most successful individual results by members of Gundagai High's Show Team in the past 18 years of showing stock in Melbourne. It is especially

significant as it was the first major show for Miles, Harrison and Joseph' said Agriculture Teacher Dale Chadwick. "The 4 students are another example of what can be achieved by those individuals who are



willing to have a go and who put in the time and effort to achieve their goals. The student's only real opportunity to practice was at lunchtimes and after school".

Four steers were prepared by students for Melbourne and 'Smiley' an Angus steer bred from a Gundagai High cow by a bull loaned to the school by Bill and Shauna Graham of Bongongo Angus was placed 2nd on the hoof in its Heavy Domestic Class. This steer proved to be overdone and lost 12 valuable points due to excess fat cover otherwise it would have placed 2nd in the carcase as well. Our highest scoring

steer was 'AbF' which was donated by Gary Williamson and Paul Ferry of Abingdon Station which scored 82.5 points, just 10 points behind the Grand Champion winner. The other two steers also suffered from

being overdone and so did not feature highly in the carcase competition.

The Show Team travelled to Melbourne on Friday the 21st September to exhibit the 4 animals they had prepared for the Beef Carcase competition. The show was held over the 2 days of the 22nd to the 23rd with Parader competitions on the Sunday and steer judging on the Saturday. Accompanying the team were teachers Veronica Thake and Dale Chadwick their Agriculture Teacher.





The students on the trip conducted themselves in a professional manner and were a credit to their families and the school.
