The Year 7 and Year 9 students who volunteered to be part of the Charles Sturt University Research Project - Trial of NAPLAN online Test design. This research and the feedback given by Gundagai High School students will inform how the NAPLAN tests of the future, from possibly 2016 onwards, will look like online.

The Year 7 and 9 students gave feedback to the researchers about the types of questions, how the questions were written, the ease of use of the computer and the functions of the program, accessibility of the questions online and other areas of the test.

This research forms part of the full research project run by Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) whose aim is about improving educational outcomes for all young Australians.

ACARA is an independent authority responsible for the development of a national curriculum, a national assessment program and a national data collection and reporting program that supports the 21st century learning for Australian students. Their work is carried out in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders, including teachers, principals, governments, state and territory education authorities, professional education associations, community groups and the general public. www.acara.edu.au

ACAR representatives also came to the school and spoke with the Principal, Jennifer Miggins, Head Teacher Maths, Phil Mann and Head Teacher Science, Allison Appleby about the Research Project, the changes around the NAPLAN test for the future and the type of feedback that the test would be able to provide for teachers with regard to student learning. We were able to give our feedback about the current NAPLAN tests, the type of feedback, the type of format that would be beneficial for teachers regarding student learning and the links required to 21st Century learning skills.

This has been an invaluable opportunity for staff and students in being able to positively influence the testing for all Australian students in the future.

NAIDOC Celebrations Excursion

All schools across the district were invited to attend a NAIDOC celebration that ran over a two week period. On Tuesday 22nd October, Mr Bridgeman, Mrs King and 42 year 7 and 8 GHS students travelled to Tumut to attend festival. Our students were combined with McAuley Catholic School and rotated around the activities in groups.

The activities throughout the day included;

- Net weaving where students learnt the traditional way to make nets for fishing and carrying things.
 Some students progressed very well in this activity.
- 2. Rope and string making using natural plant materials.
- 3. Aboriginal art and storytelling where students were asked to tell a visual story through art. They were given a chart with many Aboriginal symbols and were also guided by the many helpful volunteers on the day.
- 4. Students were shown how to play the yidaki (didgeridoo) and learnt how it was first discovered. They also experienced throwing boomerangs, making axes and painting ochre on their faces.

Unfortunately the afternoon activities were cancelled as the rain set in and we were not able to play the traditional games.
