We would like to make up a roster to ensure there are plenty of helpers at all times.



Deputy Principal Message's

Is your child's backpack damaging their spine?

A recent Australian study has shown that approximately 25% of school-aged children suffer from back and/or neck pain at any one time. It's believed to be due to a combination of factors such as poor posture, everyday load carrying and the use of computers.

The Children's Hospital at Westmead suggests young people should:

- not carry more than 10% of their body weight
- use a backpack with the straps over both shoulders and a waist strap
- load gear so that the heavier objects are nearer to the spine, with the lighter objects towards the front of the pack
- lift a backpack properly- bend at the knees and lift the pack with both hands

Year 10 Geography Fieldwork

On Monday 27th October all of Year 10 ventured to Lake Albert, Wagga Wagga to undertake some fieldwork with Darron Watt from the Riverina Environmental Education Centre. Fieldwork is a mandatory part of the Stage 5 Geography Syllabus and this excursion allowed students to witness and investigate some of the "Issues in Australian Environments".

Upon arrival, we completed some water tests for salinity, phosphorous, turbidity and pH levels. We witnessed 3 cod being caught within half an hour.

However, the elements were against us and we experienced rain, lightning and then extremely strong winds. We completed some soil tests and observed the Riparian Zone quickly after the rain, checked the piezometer for the water table height and salinity content. We had a look at some of the management strategies used to combat issues in the lake, such as the sediment trap and artificial wetland and came home.

Thankyou to Miss Ly and Darron Watt for accompanying us on the excursion & Brian Smith for saving us from the weather with the bus.
