Remembrance Day Speeches 2014

Good Morning Ladies and Gentlemen,

I'm Sabrina Meurs, and with my fellow School Captains Brodie Paton and Zoe Watson, we're representing Gundagai High School.

On this day in 1918, the Germans called for an Armistice, in order to secure a peace settlement after more than four years of war. It is the day when the guns fell silent, marking the end of World War 1. This day is called Remembrance Day, and it is the day in which we stop to remember those who fought for our country, and gave their lives for us in all armed conflicts and wars.

On the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month, the Armistice was signed 96 years ago. There was supposed to be no more conflict, no more lives to be lost, and it was the day that our soldiers realised they were going to return home. It was initially called Armistice Day, however, after World War 2, it was renamed Remembrance Day. It is an important day recognised by countries around the world. It is a day for countries to remember, and honour, their fallen soldiers, who had not only fought in World War 1, but other wars such as World War 2 and Vietnam.

Each year we take a moment of our time to acknowledge the sacrifice made by soldiers past and present. I believe that it is important to incorporate the standards and values of our servicemen and women into our everyday lives. For me, this means to show loyalty, mateship and appreciation within my family as well as the community. I show respect to all citizens by taking time away from myself to give to others. I pride myself on making a positive contribution to my community and I value the opportunities I have as a result of the sacrifices of others. While we remember the sacrifices of others on this day in particular, I strive to carry the spirit of remembrance with me every day and in all my pursuits.

Gundagai soldier James Bell was one of many troops from Gundagai that helped protect our country during World War 1. He joined the 18th Australian Infantry Battalion on 31st May 1915. He enlisted with his two brothers, Jack and Tom. James was shot twice, suffered trench fever and severe gas poisoning, and required transportation to England for medical treatment. After recuperating each time he returned to the war front to resume his duty. James's brother Tom had been killed a few years earlier at Gallipoli, just eight weeks after the initial landings at Anzac Cove. James then witnessed his other brother Jack, killed in action. Jack was killed by a shell burst and James crawled from his trench to bury his brother. If there can be any beauty to war, it is the mateship and loyalty between comrades.

James returned home to Gundagai after having to leave his brothers behind on the battle front. After this very sad time in the Bell families' life, they named their property 'Lone Pine' in honour and memory of their lost sons. On the hill at 'Lone Pine' Gundagai, stands a tree that has stubbornly refused to die, even during bushfire and years of drought. That tree was planted from seeds brought back from the Gallipoli Peninsula by James Bell. Like the Lone Pine, every tree standing here around us today, is in memory of the life of a lost son of Gundagai. When remembering the fallen it is not hard to look for what their sacrifice has provided. The beds in which we sleep or the education that I am provided is evidence of our freedom. I refuse to waste this freedom and endeavour to put 100% into everything I do. We gather here today as free Australians with countless opportunities and choices; and I believe we should choose to live a purposeful life in memory of our servicemen.

Although our soldiers have passed, they still live on through us.


