

Australia V South Africa One Day International Cricket

Australia took a 2-1 lead in the one-day international series against South Africa with a 73-run victory in the third game, at Manuka on Wednesday 19th November. GHS participated in this historical event by attending the first ever day/night ODI held at Manuka Oval. Fifty one GHS students, one grandparent and three teachers travelled to Canberra to experience the atmosphere of the live cricket match. 
