

# **Aboriginal Science and Engineering Program**



Congratulations to GHS Year 7 student Riley who was selected to attend the Aboriginal Science and Engineering Program (ASEP) at the University of New South Wales which was held in week 8 this term. He was one of only twelve Year 7 students chosen from throughout NSW. The three day camp was action packed with exposure to cutting edge technologies such as the Virtual Reality Simulator that virtually transported participants into the belly of a mine site, the World Cup winning football playing Robots and exploring space in 3D to learn about Indigenous sky stories in Sydney's newest Digital Planetarium at the Sydney Observatory.

# **Year 6 Orientation Day**

Students from five local primary schools attended the Year 6 Orientation Day last Wednesday at Gundagai High School. The day was action packed with students having the opportunity to experience a wide variety of high school subjects and activities. The orientation day gave students the chance to mix with students from other primary schools and experience firsthand what high school is like. The morning session consisted of six taster lessons with various teachers from different faculties running each lesson. In the afternoon, the students were treated to a display from the school's RFS cadets and were a fantastic audience for the cadets' graduation ceremony. The day concluded with an enjoyable sport session where the high participation and positive sportsmanship of all students was noteworthy.

# Year 7 Auslan

This year we have trialled an Introduction to Auslan course for our Year 7s as part of their Tec rotation. Auslan is the language of the Deaf community of Australia and Gundagai High School is the only state high school in NSW offering such a course in Year 7. Next year, Auslan will again run but this time as a year-long course. This means next year's Year 7 students will have more chance to develop their awareness of Deaf culture and gain greater skills in using and communicating in Auslan. Gundagai High will also be seeking to have their pilot Auslan course accredited with the NSW Board of Studies, following input from the NSW Deaf Society and the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children. Gundagai High School is extremely grateful to Rachel Jones and her partner Mark. Rachel and Mark are the parents of one of our students, Justin Jones and are members of the Gundagai Deaf community. Both have been very generous in giving their time to assist us in the practical aspects of learning Auslan. We look forward to another great year learning about signing.
