educate the students about values and morals. An example of this is the part he plays in recycling at the school and raising money for the local Can Assist.



### PRE MELBOURNE SHOW PREPARATIONS

The Gundagai High School Show Steers and Heifer team are starting to make their final preparations for their upcoming competition at the Royal Melbourne Show. Six students have been parading, weighing and grooming the six animals over the past 16 weeks in the lead up to the show. The team will travel to the Melbourne Show on Friday 20 September with the actual competition to occur on the following Monday and the Parader competition on the Tuesday. The team consisting of Matilda Carberry, Jarrah Ransom, Kynan Crossley, Tom Sharman, Brock White and Bill Elphick who will travel by bus to Melbourne accompanied by teachers Mrs Casey Norden and Mr Dale Chadwick.

Three of the steers were donated by local producers with the Shaw family from Abingdon Station continuing a long tradition by providing an Angus steer 'Chips' to the school for this event. The Graham family from Bongongo Angus also donated a steer 'Chuck' and continue to provide a



bull each year for the school by which the school steer 'Gravy' and heifer 'Dianne' were sired. Mark and Suzie Sharman have also provided an Angus steer 'Scotch'.

The other steer 'Rocky' is an Angus X Angus/Belted Galloway. The Elworthy family have again assisted with mixing the feed and donating the hay.

I must express my sincere thanks to Aaron Nicholls and the Nicholls Family trust, who even during this current climatic hardship were able to donate some of the grain required to prepare the stock.

All the very generous donations the team has received have come at a time of climatic and financial extremes on farms and the school and students are very appreciative.

Elders have again supplied the team vests and Gundagai Meat Processors have made a donation to help reduce the cost of the trip to the students. Again, our sincere thanks must go to Mark and Susie Sharman who are transporting the steers to Melbourne at no cost to the school. This is a significant donation and very much appreciated. I would also like to thank the Gundagai High School P&C who have just purchased a cattle clipping chute for the team to use at school and whilst in Melbourne. The \$1800 chute has been on the teams' wish list for a while and the P&C were very keen to make that a reality for the students.

# **Meningococcal Awareness**

As we head into late winter and spring, NSW Health are urging everyone to be alert to the symptoms of meningococcal disease.

NSW Health have launched a state wide campaign about identifying the symptoms of meningococcal disease.

Meningococcal disease is caused by a bacterial infection that can lead to serious illness if not recognised and treated in time. While anyone can contract meningococcal disease, infection rates are higher in children aged 0 - 4 years and young people aged 15 - 24 years.

### Do you know the symptoms of meningococcal disease?

Symptoms of meningococcal disease include:

- Sudden onset of fever
- Headache
- Neck stiffness
- Joint pain
- · Dislike of bright lights
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Irritability
- Rash of red-purple spots or bruises that doesn't disappear when pressure is applied. (A rash does not always appear or it may occur late in the disease).

Some or all of these symptoms may appear and can mimic other common illnesses. Symptoms usually occur suddenly and can get worse quickly, so it's important to seek urgent medical treatment.

Vaccination is the best way to prevent the spread. The NSW School vaccination program provides free vaccination against meningococcal disease for year 10 students in 2019. Students ages 15-16 can access free vaccine from their GP.

## Act fast and seek medical advice quickly

People infected with meningococcal disease can become extremely unwell very quickly. People who could have meningococcal disease should seek urgent medical advice.
