Street Stall

There was some excellent prizes donated, including the items supplied by families for the hampers, cooking from families and our Yr 9/10 Food Technology class. Major prizes were also donated by Elders and Moey's. It is always a pleasure to see everyone working together to achieve a common goal.

Mobile Device Policy

Throughout this term the school has been communicating and consulting with staff, students and parents about our current Mobile Device Policy and collecting information for possible ways to enhance our student learning outcomes, social interactions within the school and improve physical activity levels during break times.

Our current policy was implemented in 2019, with a few minor alterations over the past 3 years. It allows students to have their devices at school, and only have them out in class when directed to do so by the teacher. Over the past 6-12 months it has become apparent that many students are not respecting the policy or other students right to a positive learning environment in the classroom, a supportive safe and respectful school environment free from online harassment. In the previous newsletter our listed concerns were

Disruptive behaviours that distract students from learning in the classroom. Lack of physical activity during breaks. Decline in positive social interaction during breaks. Negative social media interaction during school hours. Filming other students and staff without permission. The school has spoken with many other schools across the region and conducted extensive research into the policies and procedures of schools across the state to determine the best way forward for Gundagai HS. Staff, Students and Parents have also had the opportunity to participate in a survey to help us understand the local context, needs and wants within the school environment.

Gundagai High School is well aware that Mobile phones are an important and integral part of today's society. They can be a powerful learning tool when used for that reason, but too often they are a distraction to students that takes them off task and then they become a contentious item in the classroom. With a change in policy we aim to maximise our learning time in lessons, not having to consistently ask for phones to be put away. Students who are doing the right thing with their devices and are there to learn deserve better use of the lesson time. Teachers are here to teach, mobile phones to often get in the way of this.

At the P&C meeting held on Monday 22 August the school proposed a system called Yondr pouches to the P&C. This was endorsed for a trial in Term 4 2022.



Yondr pouches enable students to still bring their mobile and still have physical possession of their mobile, however, they remove the distraction and temptation by having the mobile locked in the pouch when they are not required. The policy still relies heavily on students taking responsibility and making sure they lock their phone in the pouch at the start of the day and also remembering to unlock them at the end of the day.

This is not meant to be a punitive measure. It is about teaching our students that phones are a temptation that causes distraction. When we remove the need to check every buzz and every notification we become more productive, have greater social connection and become more physically active with our peers. It will also remove the negative social media influences that are affecting many student's engagement and enjoyment of school life.

The school is still working through how to best implement this strategy. Therefore it is still important to get as much feedback as possible and to hear the parents voice, if you have not completed the Mobile Device survey, it is still available until Wednesday 31 August via the link sent in an email last week and there will be hard copies available at the variety night. The surveys will help us build our new Mobile Device policy and how we utilise the Yondr pouches to maximise student learning opportunities and engagement in the school community.
